DELIVERY MODE

These skills sets are presented as an on-line program combined with workplace assessment. Once enrolled, students will be provided with access to the AEATS online delivery platform and will work their way through a series of learning and assessment tasks. The final component of the assessment is to ensure that students can apply their learning in the workplace. For this reason, you must have access to a workplace and someone who supervises your work where you undertake infection control procedures. FEE FREE ENROLMENT CONDITIONS

Applicants seeking to enrol must meet the following criteria:

- Be 16 years or older
- Have successfully completed year 10 of secondary school or equivalent or be of mature age.
- Be able to use and respond to written language, including some unfamiliar material in a variety of contexts.
- Provide photo identification & Medicare card
- There are no prerequisite units of competence
- Have access to a valid workplace and supervisor for assessment purposes.
- Have a primary place of residence within NSW.
- Must be an Australian Citizen /Permanent Resident /New Zealand Citizen or hold a Humanitarian visa.
- Be able to supply a valid USI (This can be obtained online)

COURSE ASSESSMENT
